Road to Renewal Update from Msgr. David LiPuma: We are presently still in the data gathering and consultation stage and documenting all data and responses for planning purposes.

1. *To date we have conducted 3 meetings with the Vicars Forane and Presbyteral Council, and 6 meetings of the Priests and Deacons of our diocese.*
2. *We hosted 18 Vicariate Zoom sessions with parishioners from across WNY, as well as with the Cultural Diversity Commission, Leadership Conference of Women Religious (LCWR) and Young Adults from throughout our diocese.*
3. *Next are hosting additional Zoom sessions with the Principals and Parish Directors of Religious Education/Formation as well as with Lay Ecclesial Ministers.*
4. *We are analyzing data from over 1,300 surveys and dozens of emails and letters.*
