The East Side Family Partnership: A few people have asked about the East Side Family Partnership... What is it? How did it come about? Who makes up the partnership? Simply, it is a collaborative venture involving Family 21 representation and Gerard Place (gerardplace.org) highlighting a Catholic social service presence in our area of the city. It came about from hereand-there conversations about ways to better address needs, offer information, and provide service to our people.
